Of Mice and Men: Steinbeck's Social Criticisms Essay (+80 points Assessment)

Directions: Steinbeck wrote *Of Mice and Men* to expose the injustices of society that existed in his time as well as in ours. Select one of the prompts below and write an essay that examines a topic of his implied social criticisms about American culture and values.

The term **social criticism** often refers to a type of disapproval or criticism that a writer feels towards malicious or severely flawed conditions in a society.

Of Mice and Men was published in 1937 in the midst of the Great Depression and the Dustbowl — arguably two of the greatest economic and ecological disasters in American history. Steinbeck witnessed firsthand the poverty, the despair, and the imbalance of power that existed between migrant farm laborers and California farmers. In his acceptance speech for the 1962 Nobel Prize for Literature, Steinbeck articulated what he believed is a writer's purpose and responsibility. He told his audience: "[A writer] is charged with exposing our many grievous faults and failures, with dredging up to the light our dark and dangerous dreams for the purpose of improvement" (Steinbeck).

How does Steinbeck use examples of alienation or discrimination to show his opinion about American society? Use direct quotations and specific examples to support your claim(s).
- 3. Analyze the dream of living "off the fatta the lan" and how it influences the characters in the novel (George, Lennie, Candy, Crooks, <u>or</u> Curley's wife). **What does Steinbeck say about the impossibility of the American Dream through these characters?** At the same time, what is the power of the dream, even if it is fruitless? Use direct quotations and specific examples to support your claim(s).
